



**1. Health Education & Awareness Campaigns-**

**8. Community Participation:** Promoting the involvement of the local community in health-related decision-making and planning. Encourage community members to take active roles in monitoring public health services.

**9. Mentorship & Capacity Building of Undergraduate & Postgraduate students.**

**10. Field Exposure for Students:** Organize field visits and internships for medical students in community health settings to give them practical exposure to public health challenges.

The Urban health training center is established in 1962 and it is at 1.5 KM distance from Bandra Railway station (East). UHTC is situated at Bandra Government colony campus near Mahatma Gandhi High School.

### Catchment area for UHTC

The catchment area compromises the government employees and their families residing in the government colony. There are various types of staff quarter buildings for Class I-IV employees. The colony campus contains three schools, many temples, one community hall, one playground, various shops, banks and Market. The campus also contains a Government Colony Bus Depot.

There are 297 type "B" buildings in government colony. Each B building is four story and having 2 quarters on each floor. So there are total around **600 quarters**. 10-12 B buildings form a circular wing, which have a central open place and one main entrance. These B buildings are constructed for Class III employees. There are 7 buildings for class IV employees. These 7 buildings compromise **1244 quarters**.

So there are around **1850 families** living in catchment area of UHTC.





Rural Health Training Centre Palghar, a distinguished Government hospital and training institute, operates under the esteemed Grant Government Medical Colleges and Sir J.J. Group of Hospitals in Mumbai. Established on November 9, 1956, this institution has been a cornerstone of healthcare and education in the region. Conveniently located 80 km away from Mumbai, on Kacheri Road in Palghar, it serves as a beacon of medical excellence for the community.

This unit is headed by Dean of Grant Government Medical College Dr. Pallavi Saple, Head of the Department of Community Medicine Dr. Geeta Pardeshi, and Associate Professor Dr. Rakesh Waghmare. The healthcare staff at RHTC includes Assistant Medical Officer, Lady medical officer, Dental surgeon, nursing staff, sanitary inspector, and lab technician. RHTC serves as a primary training centre for students of Grant Medical College Mumbai, offering them hands-on experience in community medicine and public health.

## **TRAINING AND EDUCATION**

RHTC manages the posting of MBBS interns, residents of Community Medicine, nursing students of all faculties, BSc PMT, and MPH students. It schedules lectures and orientations, plans and conducts various visits to health centres, provides training on health education and community mobilization and offers clinical management in OPD and IPD.

## **ONGOING FIELD PRACTICES AND RESEARCH PROJECTS**

RHTC is involved in ongoing field practices and research projects in and around the RHTC in Palghar. These include community-based cross-sectional studies and assessments on various topics such as the ECCE component of the ICDS program, the prevalence of anxiety disorders among adolescents, breastfeeding practices, utilization gaps in institutional delivery promoting schemes, and more.
